


A First-Timer's Guide to Lilies War

What to see and do

The Fydraca

This replica of a viking-era boat is one of Lilies War's most iconic attractions. The boat is docked on the point near the battlefield and offers rides throughout the war. There are no set boarding times, so listen for the horn. Be warned, passengers will be asked to row... or bail!



The Great Machine

Powered by Calontir's favorite furry friends, the Great Machine is a dog-powered mill. Stop by to see the dogs run on the machine and to learn about the use of machinery and animal power in the middle ages.

Artisan's Road Show

On Friday morning of War Join us on Noble's Row where the various artisans of the kingdom will be holding a demonstration of their craft.

The Lake

The lake is open for swimming. One of the most popular spots is located near the permanent shelter.

Tailor's Tent

Over the course of the war, volunteers at the Tailor's Tent sew an outfit for their Majesties to wear. Stop by and lend a few stitches to the project!

Glass Tent

The glass tent is located in the RUSH area and provides a unique opportunity to learn how to use fire to melt glass into beads and vessels.

Pottery Tent & Dragon Kiln

The pottery tent is located in the RUSH area and provides classes where you can learn to make your own pottery. Better yet, you may have the opportunity to have your work fired in the wood-fired dragon kiln that is built on-site each year. Make sure to stop by on Wednesday afternoon (weather permitting) to see the dragon breathe fire.

Noontime Singing

Each day at noon, a group gathers to sing medieval music. You are welcome to join in.

Classes

Calontir's Royal University (RUSH) offers dozens of classes on a wide variety of medieval arts and sciences each day of the war. For more information, consult your site booklet.

Artisans

There are a number of artisans who set up their shop at Lilies. You'll find a wood-wright's shop set up across from the shower, several blacksmiths, and a metal foundry. What else can you find?

Bardic Encampment

Calontir loves to sing, so of course there's an encampment dedicated to bardic activities. Stop by in the evenings and plan on joining in on the singing. Don't worry, you don't need to know the words, you'll figure them out and if you can't sing well, sing loud.

Social Activities and Parties

The Broken Harp Tavern

If you don't know where to go, head to the Broken Harp. The tavern offers a wide assortment of both alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages throughout the war on a by-donation basis. A crowd gathers at the Harp most evenings and singing usually ensues. The Harp will also be hosting a Sci-fi themed party on Sunday night and will be offering a bounty on newcomers throughout the war, so if it's your first time at Lilies, stop by the Harp to claim your prize.

Middle-Eastern Hafla

Come join the Falcon Wing Dancers on Sunday night for their second Annual night of Middle Eastern dancing and music on the swimming beach! There will be a few light snacks and non-alcoholic drinks provided.

Blue Feather Party

Clan Blue Feather is an inter-kingdom social organization comprised of LGBT+ individuals and their allies. One of the goals of Clan Blue Feather is to support and encourage the study and research of LGBT+ topics during the middle ages and Renaissance eras. Please join us on Monday from 6-9 at the Broken Harp Tavern for an evening of socializing to start your war off right! All are welcome and encouraged to attend!

Bardi-graf

As the name implies, Bardi-graf is a bardic party held in the bardic encampment on Monday night. The festivities start with a kids parade in the late afternoon. At nightfall (o'dark 30), a torchlight armored bear pit is held, with plenty of singing afterwards. Snacks and drinks will be provided. Come ready to sing!

Helga Ball

What is Helga Ball? Think Rugby, Soccer, Flag Football, and wrestling all rolled into one. On Tuesday at 6pm, two teams of women will face off in this fun and exciting game. Participants must wear closed-toed shoes and bring a garment that they can use to catch the ball such as a head scarf or dress.

Tor Tuesday

On Tuesday night, the canton of Aston Tor hosts their annual Tor party. The party is renowned for its drumming, belly dancing, and singing.

Barony of Cover d'Ennvi Party

This party has a laid-back atmosphere, but it's anything but Boar-ring. On Wednesday night, the barony offers its hospitality in the permanent shelter near the battlefield.

Calontir Party

Their Royal Majesties Ashir and Ashland invite all to join them on Thursday night following the armored Ladies of the Rose Tourney for the Calontir party. There will be food, drinks, and the ever popular Mongolian Wrestling.

Barony of Mag Mor Party

Ahoy Mateys! On Thursday night, the Dred Pirate 'Captain Gack Goodrum "Hound of the sea!" and the Barony of Mag Mor will be hosting a pirate-themed party at the Great machine. Both sea-dogs and landlubbers are welcome.

Lilies Ball

Try out your medieval dance moves. The Lilies ball is held on Thursday night in the permanent shelter. No previous dance experience is necessary, but several medieval dance classes will be held throughout the week.

Barony of Three Rivers Party

Held in conjunction with the fireworks on Friday night, the B3R party typically features a sampling of beverages provided by the barony's talented brewers, snacks, and singing around a campfire.
